"Just one week into the voting period, yet another leading mass tort law firm has announced its support of the reorganization Plan for the final and comprehensive resolution of the ovarian talc claims.

Aylstock, Witkin, Kreis and Overholtz, PLC ("AWKO"), a firm that was adamantly opposed to a resolution in bankruptcy, <u>announced</u> that they too are advising their clients to vote "yes" for the Plan, as it is in the claimants' best interest. In their press release, AWKO points to the fact that the Plan "would secure meaningful, timely recoveries for eligible clients" and "allocates substantial resources" as to why they are voting in favor.
